Application materials to be provided	• Letter of recommendation by your home university • Application form validated by home institution • Résumé or CV • Most recent grade transcripts in either French or English • Copy of official ID papers (passport for non-EU students, ID card) • Proof of language proficiency • Learning agreement validated by home institution • Health insurance certificate or European Health Insurance Card A certified copy of your birth certificate in French is needed for certain French administrations
Work placement/internship	A work placement/internship is possible only if the student has the necessary language level to work in a French-speaking environment. Students must contact the host department or company directly. ESCEM does not organize Erasmus or any other internship training.
French language classes	French language classes are mandatory for all exchange students (no fee).
Immigration	All Non-European students must have a valid visa, which must cover the whole period of study at ESCEM. An acceptance letter will be emailed to students and a hard copy sent to home universities, in order to start visa application.
Health care	EU students: must obtain a European Health Insurance (EHIC) card and supply a copy on arrival. Non-EU students: Health insurance is mandatory. On arrival, you will get all the information to sign up to French Health insurance, if you wish to do so. Cost is approximately €90.
Computer services	All students are given an ESCEM e-mail address on arrival, as well as passwords to access the campus Wi-Fi.
Insurance	ESCEM assumes NO LIABILITY for any costs if a student is not properly insured. All students must be covered for medical repatriation and civil liability.
Fees Approximate monthly budget (depending on student's lifestyle)	No tuition or registration fees for exchange students. Students are required to pay for their accommodation, housing insurance, food, travel expenses and any other living costs. Rent (all charges included): From €300 for a state owned flat and from €500 for a private landlord Meals: € 200 to € 350 Communication: € 30 to € 50 City bus and tram pass: € 30 euros per month
