- 1 clearly readable scan of passport or identity card
- 1 passport picture in JPG
- A scan of a valid health insurance policy in English (for EU students; EHIC). The EHIC/health insurance policy must be valid throughout the study period at Windesheim UAS.
- <u>Full year students only</u>: 1 photocopy of birth certificate, with an apostille or double legalisation. **Note:** Original birth certificate is needed in order to register with the municipality.
- Design students only: portfolio of work
- Nursing students: the result of Hepatitis B titre test and MRSA result
- <u>Students following the honours college programme</u>: comprehensive motivation letter
