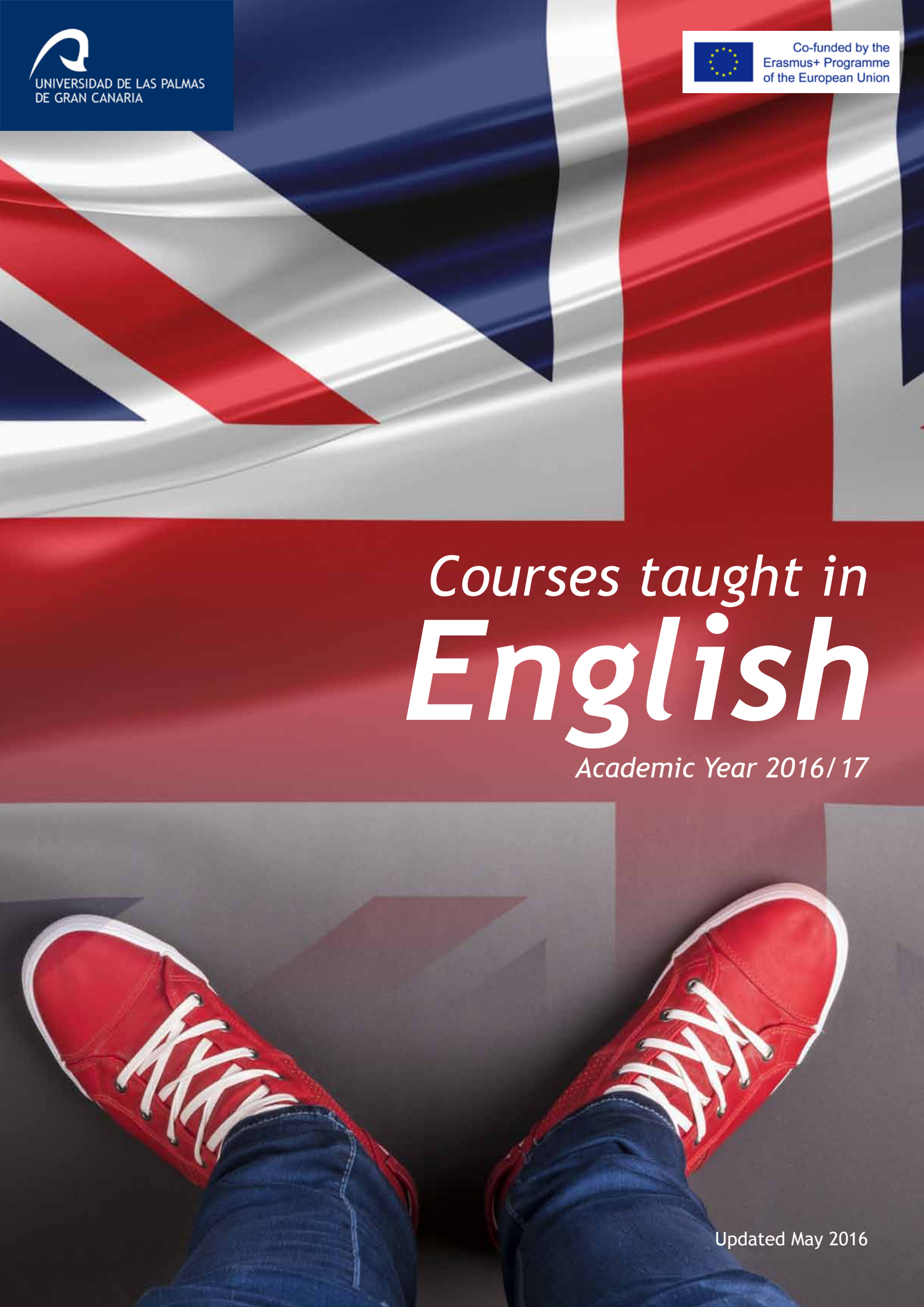

(*) The Internship takes place during the fourth year of the Bachelor's Degree Programs. During an internship the student will be doing similar (albeit unpaid) work to a normal employee of the organisation. The Internship depends on the resources of the Faculty/School and it cannot be guaranteed for all exchange students.

(**) The Bachelor's Final Degree Dissertation is required at the end of the fourth year of the Bachelor's Degree Programs and is a written paper that is supervised by a member of the teaching staff at ULPGC, but the credits are transferred to the transcript of records only if these are the last remaining credits required to complete the degree. Moreover, being able to enrol for the Final Dissertation depends on various aspects as well as the resources of the departments and it cannot be guaranteed for all exchange students.

Language requirements. Completing a Dissertation requires a certain level of English language skills, especially in academic writing. The minimum level of English language skills is B1 on the CEFR scale. Students applying for a final project must submit a certificate stating the level of their English language skills.
