Trimester system

Deakin follows a three-trimester system that is equivalent in course load and duration to a semester system. When planning your program, keep in mind that the Deakin academic calendar follows the calendar year:

- Trimester 1: February to June
- Trimester 2: July to October
- Trimester 3: November to February

Unit selection procedure

Students should select units as part of their application process. Entry into units is dependent upon availability, faculty approval and subject to meeting any prerequisites. Please ensure that units selected are run on the correct campus in the correct trimester. See our online handbook for more information.

Study load per trimester

Each unit is weighted at one credit point. A full-time study load is a minimum of three credits taken on campus and maximum of four credits taken per trimester.

Beach Welcome Program

Our two-day Beach Welcome Program is set in the picturesque seaside town of Lorne. It is designed to help Exchange and Study Abroad students transition into Australian university life. Students get to participate in activities such as surfing, hiking and yoga on the beach. Or they can just sit back and watch the waves roll in.

Deakin campuses

Each of Deakin's campuses has a distinctive character, providing quality services, world-class facilities and on-campus accommodation.

Melbourne Burwood Campus

The Melbourne Burwood Campus is located in Melbourne's green, eastern suburbs, 45 minutes by tram from the city. On route, the tram passes through some great urban villages. The campus offers great facilities such as a motion capture animation studio, a purpose-built gymnasium and sports hall, cafés and excellent learning spaces. The campus also offers a full range of courses in arts, sciences, health, business and education.

Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus

The Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus is a convergence of coastal and city lifestyles. It is on the western edge of the city and features landscaped grounds and extensive sporting facilities. It is Deakin's second largest campus with a comprehensive range of course offerings.

Geelong Waterfront Campus

The Geelong Waterfront Campus is located on the foreshore of Corio Bay in the central business district of Geelong. Originally built in 1893, the buildings have been extensively renovated to create a modern and impressive campus. A range of courses are offered at Waterfront including architecture, construction management, nursing, social work, occupational therapy and business.

Warrnambool Campus

The Warrnambool Campus is set on the banks of the Hopkins River, close to local surf beaches, just three hours from Melbourne by train or car. Located near a thriving regional city, the close-knit campus is home to a friendly community of students and academics. It offers a full range of arts, sciences, education and business courses. If your interest lies in marine sciences, then this is the place for you.
