From now on, nominations and student applications will be managed through this platform. Please find the instructions for the incoming process below:






Student's nomination

- After receiving the email, please go to our **Connext webpage**


In the top part of the page you'll find the student nomination section:



Please download our nominations template found in the third button:




After you fill out the nomination template with your students' information, save it on your computer. When you click the "select file" in the first button you will able to select the nomination document from your computer:

Student's application

- After our partners have completed the nomination process, the nominated students will automatically receive a username and password through the indicated email, to access the system and start their application process

Externado's International Career Pathways Coordination will examine each application. In case of acceptance, we will upload the acceptance letter to the student's profile in Connext.

3 ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Full course load per semester:

Except different rules from home universities, an exchange student must take a full course load at Universidad Externado, which is equivalent to 18 credits per semester (around 6/8 subjects).

1 credit = 48 study hours/semester

4 ELECTION OF COURSES

Foreign students are authorized to select courses from different programs; however, they must take at least 60% of credits in the school of registration. The exact number of courses or ECTS credits must be determined by the home institution. Before coming at Externado, students must pre-select their subjects through the Connext system.





5 Professional Volunteering Program

The School of Finance, Government and International Relations proposes a Professional Volunteer Program, which offers our visiting students the opportunity to increase the socio-cultural knowledge as a complement of their academic activities.

The program allows students to work with some recognized Colombian and International NGO's such as *Barefoot Foundation* and *Techo* among others, getting to know the real needs of the most vulnerable Colombian population.

The students receive academic credits for this activity. The number of credits will depend on the number of worked hours. The registration process starts at the beginning of each semester.

Accommodation

Universidad Externado does not have on-campus accommodation. However, the University has agreements with <u>LivvinX</u> and <u>CityU</u> two residential buildings that offer student dorm style accommodation and provide a special discount for international exchange students from Universidad Externado. Expenses

It is important to know that Bogotá is the third most expensive capital of Latin America. Depending on the needs, the average expenses per month could be around 400 \$US / 600 \$US.

Some estimated expenditures

Housing:

Apartments: from 200\$US to 400\$US/month Food: 150\$US/month

<u>Lunch in a restaurant close to the University</u>: 5\$US (15000 Pesos COP)

Public Transport: 50\$US/month
