The students follow two compulsory courses (French language and French history and civilization) and must choose at least 3 courses among those offered in the 1st, 2nd and 4th years (1st year Masters). They can choose one course taught in foreign language at the most.	The programme offers a general introduction to the political, social, and cultural landscapes of France and Europe, and examines important issues and debates in France today; all classes are taught in English. The curriculum takes the form of 5 compulsory modules per semester over two semesters. Each of these modules is worth 6 credits per semester and is composed of either one 20-hour course (6 ECTS) or two 10-hour courses (2x3 ECTS). Within these five modules is a compulsory French course – French as a Foreign Language (FLE) – which comprises 4 or 2 hours a week over 12 weeks (48h -6 ECTS or 24h-3 ECTS) in each semester. For the students whose level in French is sufficient, they have to choose a lecture in French. This lecture will be selected among the "conferences de méthodes" offered in the Institute of Political Studies' programme that is compatible with the students' schedule. This class will account for 3 ECTS per semester. The remaining four modules are within the relevant field in the social sciences. The DPSE or the CPSE is awarded to students achieving an overall average mark greater than or equal to 10/20. Students who do not achieve an overall average mark of 10/20 will only be awarded the credits for those courses in which they have achieved the average mark. If students enrolled in Diploma of Political Studies in English obtain satisfactory results in French at the end of the first semester, they may
		request a transfer to the French Certificate of Political Studies programme in semester 2, giving them access to a wider range of classes, mainly taught in French.
		As this programme is opened to around 30 students, with no or little French upon arrival, Sciences Po Rennes reserves the right to make a selection. If your students are interested in this programme, indicate it on the nomination sheet.



Application procedure and deadlines:

1) Nominations	Home university announce the names of the selected students to Sciences Po Rennes by completing every data requested in our Excel data-sheet "Announcement" and return it by email to: relations.internationales@sciencespo-rennes.fr best before 30 April for an admission in September and best before 30 September for an admission in January.
2) Applications	After the nomination, the students will receive the link to complete the on-line application form. This form will be available (in English or in French) in March for an admission in September and in October for an admission in January.
	Deadlines for application:
	31 May for 1 st semester or the academic year (for an admission in September)
	31 October for 2 nd semester (for an admission in January)
	3) When the application has been submitted with the required documents, the International Relations Office sends a letter of admission or refusal to the students within 4 weeks.
	4) They will receive an information package by email, according to the chosen study program, mid-July for the admission in September or at the end of November for the admission in January.

The IEP has an agreement with the CROUS which deals with accommodation in halls of residence. The CROUS authorities have fixed a rather drastic quota on the number of student bedrooms allocated to the IEP-Rennes for our international students. That is to say that we normally obtain a small number of the rooms we apply for. This is why the IEP can't guarantee a room to each student. We will inform by email your students of the result of the rooms attribution at the end of June for an admission in September and in November for an admission in January. If the IEP could not reserve a room for your students, the student association 'Zephyr" will help them in their research for housing.
