Who signs my certificate of arrival and what do I have to do with it?

During your first appointment at the International Office, you will receive two signed and identical certificates of arrival. Please send one of these originals to your home university and present the second one at the end of your stay to the International Office together with your certificate of departure.

When and where do I get my student ID card?

You can collect your student ID card in person during office hours from Monika Lent-Öztürk at the International Office three to five days after you have submitted all your enrolment documents and paid the semester fee. Please bring your passport with you.

What does my student ID card entitle me to?

With your student ID card, you can use all HHU services and facilities, for example:

- Get a library card for the University and State Library
- Attend courses run by the Student Academy, e.g. German and other language courses
- Access the Multimedia Centre
- Take part in University sports
- Get a student canteen card (MensaCard)

What does my travel pass entitle me to?

Your student ID card is at the same time your travel pass, i.e. from the beginning of the semester (1st of April / 1st of October) you can use all buses, trams and trains with the prefixes U, S, RE and RB (2nd class) throughout the whole of North Rhine-Westphalia free of charge. You can take a second person with you free of charge from Monday to Friday after 19:00 as well as all day on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. You can take your bicycle with you free of charge on all VRR trams and trains with the prefixes U, S, RE and RB.

Until the semester starts (1st of April / 1st of October) you must buy bus, tram and train tickets from one of the Rheinbahn's machines. Information about tickets and prices can be found on their website under: www.rheinbahn.com/tickets (English) | www.rheinbahn.de/tickets (German)

We also recommend the Rheinbahn app for your smartphone which gives you up-to-date information about train and bus connections and timetables. Once you have moved into a room or apartment in Düsseldorf, you must register yourself and your place of residence within one week at the Residents' Registration Office (Einwohnermeldeamt) of the City of Düsseldorf, regardless of how long you intend to stay here.

You will need the following documents in order to register:

- ID card or passport, with visa if applicable
- Tenancy agreement or confirmation from your landlord that you have moved in
- In some cases your certificate of enrolment

You must also notify the Residents' Registration Office and HHU Student Services if you move home during your stay in Düsseldorf.

What does the canteen card (MensaCard) entitle me to and where can I get it?

With the canteen card, you can pay for meals and beverages in the canteens and cafeterias run by Düsseldorf Student Services and use the washing machines in the halls of residence. You can buy a card for \in 2.50 at Cafeteria Bistro Uno in Building 21.11. Please present your student ID card or your certificate of enrolment. You need to "top up" your card with money. You can do that at the machines in the main canteen (Building 21.11) or at some of the checkouts there.

AT THE START OF YOUR STUDIES

How can I register for courses?

You will receive your personal university identifier and an email address together with your student ID card.

Activate your email address under https://idm.hhu.de.

You will then have access to the University's electronic course calendar (HIS-LSF) and can register online for courses.

Can I attend German courses during the semester?

Yes, you may participate free of charge in the German language courses offered by the German as a Foreign Language Centre at HHU's Student Academy, provided that you have taken the obligatory placement test.

The International Office will notify you of the time and date of the placement test.

You can register for German courses once you know the result of your placement test.

Is there an app to help me find my way around campus?

Yes, the HHU's free "myHHU" app. Alongside a campus navigation function with a route planner, the app gives you an overview of current events, important information from central University facilities, the menu in the main canteen and lots of other useful tips for everyday life on campus.

The "myHHU" app can be downloaded free of charge from authorised app stores for android as well as iOS (Apple).

DURING YOUR STUDIES

Who can help me with questions about my studies at HHU?

The ERASMUS Officer in your department is the person to contact for all general academic questions or ones related to your specific subject, e.g. the learning agreement and the transcript of records.

How can I change my learning agreement?n?

Please contact your ERASMUS Officer at the relevant HHU faculty if you want to change your learning agreement.

How can I extend my ERASMUS visit?

To extend your ERASMUS visit you first of all require the written consent of the ERASMUS Coordinator at your home university and of your ERASMUS Officer at your faculty at HHU.

You should then please send both consent declarations by email to Monika Lent-Öztürk at HHU's International Office: exchange-students@hhu.de.

Can I renew my tenancy agreement with Düsseldorf Student Services?

Your tenancy agreement will not be renewed automatically. Please contact Düsseldorf Student Services at least two months beforehand and enquire whether your tenancy agreement can be renewed.

Who is my contact person in my hall of residence?

In each hall of residence there are tutors whom you can ask if you have any questions or problems related to your accommodation, everyday student life and recreational activities. The tutors also organise events and joint activities. Further information can be found on the noticeboards in your hall.

Who is in charge of repairs for my room in hall?

Facility Management is in charge of repairs for your room in hall. Please register any damage online under: www.btsportal.de/stw/ (German version, for the English version please click on "English" in the top right-hand corner).

Where can I get my transcript of records?

The ERASMUS Officer or someone else at your faculty will issue your transcript of records. Please arrange an appointment at least two weeks prior to your departure date and present all your certificates of attendance and records of your exam and course achievements.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE

Who signs my certificate of departure?

Please complete the form provided by your home university and present it during office hours together with your certificate of arrival to Monika Lent-Öztürk at the International Office for signature.

Please note that we can only sign your certificate of departure at the earliest one week before your given date of departure!

Where must I de-register? And why?

Please de-register 3 to 5 days before your departure at HHU Student Services. You will need your certificate of de-registration if you want to study at a German university again. Getting the certificate later is a tedious process.

What do I need to note when I move out of my hall of residence?

Please arrange an appointment with the manager of your hall of residence to hand over your room and the keys. Only if you hand over your room in a clean and undamaged condition will he/she reimburse your deposit in full. If there is any damage to the room, the cost of the repairs will be deducted from your deposit.

When and where must I sign off my place of residence?

When you leave Düsseldorf, you must sign off at the Residents' Registration Office of the City of Düsseldorf or the local town hall.

Visiting the doctor and medication

In life-threatening cases, please do not hesitate to dial 112 and call an ambulance.

In Germany, you can only obtain prescription medication from a pharmacy and with a doctor's prescription. As a rule, your health insurer will pay for such medication, but you will often have to pay a pharmacy fee of between \in 3 and \in 10. Pharmacies are generally open on Monday to Friday from 8:30 to 18:30 and on Saturday morning. Some pharmacies close over lunchtime. Outside opening hours, you can go to the pharmacy on emergency duty. You can find out which pharmacy that is on the internet or in the daily newspaper.

Deposit for cans and bottles

A deposit of between 8 and 25 cents is charged for most bottles and cans. This means that when you buy beverages in one-way and re-usable bottles you pay this additional charge which is reimbursed when you return the empty bottles and cans to the shop. You can either deposit your empty bottles and cans in the machine or sometimes hand them in at the checkouts. A deposit is also charged on most of the bottles you buy in HHU's main canteen and cafeterias.

Recycling and waste separation

In Germany, there are different dustbins for different types of waste. The following types of waste must be separated:

- Paper: Blue dustbin or special containers in the street
- Packaging with the "Green Dot" symbol: Yellow sacks or yellow dustbins
- Non-recyclable waste: Grey or black dustbin
- Glass: Special containers in the street
- Dead batteries: special boxes in supermarkets

Radio and TV licence

Each apartment or house pays a monthly charge of \in 17.98 for radio, TV and internet. This is a flat-rate licence fee regardless of how many people live there and how many appliances there are.

WiFi at HHU

WiFi is available in almost all HHU buildings. You can choose between two networks: HHUD-W (unencrypted) and eduroam (encrypted). You need your university identifier and the respective password for both.
