Academic Calendar - Lecture Period - Exam Period

The academic year at JGU is officially split in two terms:

- the winter term lasts from October 01 to March 31
- the summer term from April 01 to September 30.

The **lecture period** takes place between mid-October and mid-February (winter) and between mid-April and mid-July (summer). For the exact dates, please visit **Fristen und Termine**. [http://www.studium.uni-mainz.de/fristen-und-termine-studium/]

There is **no general exam period** at our university. Exams take place at the end of the lecture period or afterwards. If you need more detailed information, please contact the department of your subject.

Semester fee - semester ticket

At JGU, there are **no tuition fees**. But all students - including exchange and ERASMUS students - have to pay the semester fee ("**Semesterbeitrag** [http://www.studium.uni-mainz.de/kosten-2/#L_Semesterbeitrag] "). The semester fee is a mandatory student services charge which entitles students to use the service institutions and benefits at JGU (e.g. student union canteen, sport facilities); thus fee payment is a necessary prerequisite for enrolment. The semester fee is about € 310 and includes a "Semesterticket".

The semester ticket ("Semesterticket [http://www.studium.uni-mainz.de/semesterticket/]") entitles you to ride all busses, streetcars and local trains (S-Bahn or Nahverkehrszug) in Mainz and Wiesbaden as well as the in the larger Rhein-Main area. The ticket is valid for the official term period (winter: October 01 to March 31; summer: April 01 to September 30), not just for the lecture period. So basically, the semester ticket obviates the need to buy a car.

German language proficiency

Exchange students do not have to pass a formal language examination in German in order to qualify for enrolment at JGU. We do, however, expect intermediate language proficiency in German equivalent to B1 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, CEFR [http://www.coe.int/t/dg4/education/elp/elp-reg/cefr_EN.asp]). This is also valid for ERASMUS students.

Students at the faculty of **Medicine and Dentistry** who want to spend their practical year in Mainz must prove German language proficiency equivalent to C1.

The Internationale Studien- und Sprachenkolleg (ISSK) offers **German language courses for exchange students** during the lecture period.

To attend the course, it is necessary to take part in an **electronic placement test**. This mandatory test takes place in the week before the lecture period starts (Mid-October, Miid-April). The application for the course will be on the same day as the placement test. Even students who consider themselves absolute beginners need to register on that day.

Costs of studying in Mainz

Everyday Expenses

Beside the first expenses on your arrival, you will need a certain sum every month (about € 700) for your everyday expenses during your stay in Mainz:

- ca. € 300 dormitory rent
- ca. € 70 health insurance (mandatory for students) and
- ca. € 330 for food, clothing and other expenditures.

(These are approximate figures; we cannot guarantee their correctness.)

Working in addition to Studying

Do NOT expect to be granted a work permit ("Arbeitserlaubnis [http://www.studium.uni-mainz.de/arbeitsrecht-auslaendischer-studierender/]") to cover the costs of your stay (exception: citizens of certain EU countries). As a rule of thumb, you will only get a work permit for 90 days per year. After your arrival, you should consult the local office of the "Bundesagentur für Arbeit" (employment office) for information about your work permit; but make sure that you can finance your stay in Mainz even without a paid job here!

Methods of Payment

The German currency is the EURO (€). You can generally pay with all common credit cards but frequently you can only pay for purchases over € 20 with a credit card. Please note that stores like grocery shops or supermarkets often do not accept credit cards.

In Germany, you cannot pay with cheques drawn on a foreign bank.

IMPORTANT:

If you come from a country within the EURO (€) zone, you can transfer money from your home country without fees using IBAN and BIC.

Please do not transfer money from a **non-European** country / a country not using the EURO (€), neither for health insurance nor security nor rent nor for the social fee. You can make all payments after your arrival in Mainz, which will save yourself high transfer fees.
